Brief Description of Proposed Action:

Beardsley Property LLC/Corbin's Corners Stash and Store LLC

Beardsley Property LLC is seeking a Special Use Permit to strip 0.98 acre of surface area in the northwestern corner of the property located at 2743 Telephone Road to create a parking lot to be used as outdoor storage for RVs, Boats, etc. This project will lie atop the high-pressure gas lines that run through the property. Utilizing this portion of the property is the highest and best use as it is not suitable for vertical construction because of the gas lines. The existing driveway that leads to the mini-storage buildings completed in 2023 will be used for this project as well.

This portion of the business will be operated under the name of Corbin's Corners Stash and Store LLC, which also operates the mini-storage buildings.

We have found our local community needs outdoor storage with other local facilities being at maximum occupancy with waiting lists during the fall and winter months. It is our intent to pull from the northern end of the Town of York as well as the surrounding Caledonia, Avon, and Pavilion townships.

We do not feel that this project will create any negative impacts on the environment or our local agricultural businesses.

Discussions with the Gas Company and NYS DOT are underway, and we do not foresee any issues with respect to the gas lines.

We look forward to your approval and serving the needs of our local community.
